We speak truth and defend the honor of others

- We tell the truth and refrain from any half-truths or deceitfulness
- We refrain from gossip and strive to eliminate it when it is heard within our church.
- We treat confidential information as a sacred trust

We serve our congregation as a united team

- We may differ from one another within meetings, but once agreed, we all embrace and champion the decision
- We recognize that unity doesn't mean uniformity. We each have different experiences, gifts, and abilities which we use in submission to one another so that the common good is advanced
- We will not be afraid to enter into conflict, but we will do it wisely, gently, and skillfully
- We are united in our purpose, vision, mission, and strategies

We submit to authority

- We are accountable to one another and willingly give and receive correction
- We submit to the constitution, by-laws and authority structures of the church
- We strive for the work of the church rather than our own personal ministries or agendas

We are people of Character

- We have servant heads, hearts and hands
- We encourage one another and our ministries
- We develop healthy families
- We share with one another about our walk with Christ

We know our calling and give ourselves to it

- We follow established procedures

- We guard and love the pastor(s), the staff, and ministry leaders
